San Antonio River Walk

The San Antonio River Walk is a verdant oasis of cypress-lined paved paths, arched stone bridges and lush landscapes. It gently winds through the city center, providing millions of visitors each year with easy access to the city's cultural hot spots, historic sites and other attractions. So the next time you have a little spare time, simply go for a stroll along the River Walk. You're sure

to find plenty of things to do. The River Walk, or Paseo del Rio, is the largest urban ecosystem in the nation. Tucked quietly below street level and only steps from the Alamo, it provides a serene and pleasant way to navigate the city. Ride a river cruiser, rent a bicycle or take your time seeing the sights on foot. With 15 miles of sidewalks and paths, the River Walk provides access to museums, the King William Historic District, 300-year-old Spanish missions, hotels, shops, restaurants and a new adventure around every turn.

Museums and Galleries

The scope of artwork in San Antonio museums and galleries is richly diverse, ranging from extensive collections of Asian, Latin American, European, American and Western art to Native American folk art. Touring exhibits may bring ancient Greek treasures or the paintings of a pop culture icon. Neighborhoods such as Southtown and King William are replete with galleries and studios showcasing the work of talented and innovative artists and artisans, many of whom make their home in San Antonio. Historic Sites & Landmarks

Five 18th-century missions stand as tribute to the men and women who brought European culture and Christianity to the region. La Villita, San Antonio's first neighborhood, is still a bustle of activity, featuring art galleries, shops and restaurants. The King William Historic District was settled by prominent German merchants in the 1800s and grew to become the most elegant residential area in the city, zoned as the state's first historic district.
