Member Board Executive - Doug McCauley has been appointed Chief Deputy Director for the Department of Housing and Community Development and his last day at the Board was March 1. The search for his replacement is underway.

<u>Sunset Review</u> - The Board is engaged in the Sunset Review process and is currently finalizing its report. The Board will review the report in June and consider it for approval at its September meeting. It is due to the Legislature November 1. The Sunset Review hearing will likely be in March of 2019.

<u>Continuing Education</u> - The Board is preparing report to the Legislature outlining performance of its continuing education program. Data is being collected on compliance levels and areas where the program can be improved upon. The report will form the basis for future improvements to the program.

The Division is conducting a CEU audit for architects in 2018. This was publicly announced in November of 2017 and resulted in numerous non-compliance notifications to the board. In an effort to standardize disciplinary action the board is working with staff to develop a matrix and policy that defines the disciplinary action based upon the violation.

Of the five (5) registered professional members, two (2) shall be registered architects (of which one (1) may be a landscape architect), two (2) shall be professional engineers, and one (1) shall be a professional land surveyor.

#### **Brief Overview of Current Issues**

The Nevada State Board of Architecture, Interior Design and Residential Design is in the process of transitioning to a more paperless office environment. Last year, the Board sent out renewal postcards to its registrants instead of the traditional two-page letter that was mailed every October to encourage its registrants to renew online. The Board will stop sending reminder postcards in 2019 and begin sending out only electronic registration renewal reminders in 2020. The board also plans to hold its 6<sup>th</sup> continuing education seminar this year in May and December to offer an opportunity for our registrants to earn the required 8 CEUs in one day. The seminar is offered in Las Vegas and Reno and it's been well-received since its inception by our Nevada registrants.

#### **Current Legislation Related to Architecture**

The Board was reviewed by the Sunset Subcommittee of the Legislative Commission along with six other boards on February 21<sup>st</sup>. The Sunset Subcommittee is planning to

review a total of 25 professional and occupational licensing boards this year. One of the issues brought up by the Sunset Subcommittee to the boards in attendance was the amount of money that should be kept in reserves, based on what they consider should be the appropriate amount for a state agency, which could vary depending on the structure of each board. We'll be having more discussions with the Sunset Subcommittee regarding this issue and other related financial matters that directly affect professional and occupational boards in the next few months. Going through sunset review reiterates the importance of having financial policies in place and performing reviews of the budget and financial statements periodically.

# WASHINGTON

#### **BRIEF OVERVIEW OF CURRENT ISSUES**

Work continued on upgrades to the on-line licensing system and now applicants can submit their applications on line. By the end of 2017, 84% of applications were submitted on line. Staff were displaced from their offices in October 2016 due to facility problems and continued to work out of temporary offices until the offices were reopened in September 2017.

#### **MISCELLANEOUS**

The board continued its outreach efforts by meeting in different regions around the state as well as meeting on university campuses. Board members met with staff and students from the architectural program at Clover Park Technical School to learn about their program and answer questions about licensing.

#### **CURRENT LEGISLATION RELATED TO ARCHITECTURE**

HB 1622 – Concerning the state building code council. This bill is heading toward passage and will impact licensees in Washington State by imposing a \$6.50 fee on individual licenses and firm registrations. The fees in addition to increased permit fees will be used to support the work of the state building code council.

HB 2994 – Updating Washington's architect registration law to increase reciprocity and align the law with national standards. This bill was introduced late in the session and failed to make it out of committee. The bill eliminates language requiring a three-year structured intern program replacing it with language referencing a structured program as determined by the board. It is anticipated the bill will be reintroduced next year.
